

Act 44 Disclosure Form for Entities Providing Professional Services to City of Scranton Pension Plans.

Introduction

Chapter 7-A of Act 44 of 2009 mandates the annual disclosure of certain information by every entity (hereinafter "Contractor") which is party to a professional services contract with one of City of Scranton's pension funds. City of Scranton has determined that the Act 44 disclosure requirements apply to Contractors who receive payment of any kind from a City of Scranton pension fund. You are expected to submit this completed form by December 15, 2011. If, for any reason, you believe Act 44 does not require you to complete this disclosure form, please provide a written explanation of your reason(s) by October 15, 2011.

Definitions for Disclosure Questions

The following definitions apply for answering the questions in this disclosure form:

Affiliated Entity: Any of the following: (1) A subsidiary or holding company of a lobbying firm or other business entity owned in whole or in part by a lobbying firm. (2) An organization recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 501 (c) established by a lobbyist or lobbying firm or an affiliated entity.

Contractor: Any person, company or other entity that receives payments, fees or any other form of compensation from a municipal pension fund in exchange for

rendering professional services for the benefit of the municipal pension fund. The term Contractor shall also include an Affiliated Entity of the Contractor.

Contributions: As defined in section 1621 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L. 1333, No. 320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code.

Executive Level Employee: An employee of a contractor or the contractor's affiliated entity who: (1) can affect or influence the outcome of the contractor's or affiliated entity's actions, policies or decision related to pension and the conduct of business with a municipality or a municipal pension system; or (2) is directly involved in the implementation or development of policies relating to pensions, investments, contracts or procurement or to the conduct of business with a municipality or a municipal pension system.

Political Committee: As defined in section 1621 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L. 133, No. 320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code.

Professional Services Contract: A contract to which the municipal pension system is a party that is: (1) for the purchase or provision of professional services, including investment services, legal services, real estate services and other consulting services; and (2) not subject to a requirement that the lowest bid be accepted.




