1. Does SAPA have a list of pre-qualified firms that perform comprehensive planning work in the area?

A. No.

2. On page 8 of the RFP, in the outline for the proposal response, there is a section 8. Fee Estimate. However, on page 1 of the RFP in the fourth paragraph it mentions that the price proposal should be in a sealed envelope. How should we present our fee information for this submittal, both in a separate envelope and in the body of our proposal? Or should section 8 make reference to the fee in the separate envelope?

A. The price proposal should be in a separate sealed envelope ONLY.

3. Is there a list available of the GIS data layers from the Conservation District?

A. The Lackawanna County Regional Planning Commission is the department that can answer this. The LCRPC has the following data layers available:

A. Cindy Campbell of DCED answers this: The \$1,200 is for training. DCED includes that in all LUPTAP contracts with no matching share required. It can be used for any type of training that the Center for Local Government Services approves, and it can be tailored to the group.

7. Regarding the transportation budget, page 4 of the RFP says 75,000, but page 10 says 92,800. Which is accurate?

A. \$92,800 is correct. It includes: 16,400 Local share
60,000 from PennDOT
<u>16,400</u> from DCED
92,800 Total 8. Will SAPA impose a size limit (page limit) on the proposals?

A. There is no size limit on the proposals, but an executive summary would be greatly appreciated.
