I had drafted one myself, but the one drafted by our solicitor is the one that I will read this evening and, as I said, I had hoped at that Mr. Courtright would have been here to do this and cast his vote as well. I move to amend Resolution 1 of 2008, the Rules of Council. I move we amend Article V, Section 1-B, by removing the

third sentence of that paragraph, "Council

members may respond to citizens' questions

and/or comments during 5-A motions," and
