5	I would like to, for the record,
6	state that Mrs. Evans is now in attendance.
7	Also, attorney John Minora is acting the
8	solicitor for this evening, and also in
9	attendance are Mr. Kevin Mitchell and
10	Mrs. Linda Aebli, from OECD.
11	Are there any speakers this evening?
12	Mr. Sbaraglia.
13	MR. SBARAGLIA: Andy, Sbaraglia,
14	citizen of Scranton. Fellow Scranton, I'm
15	going to read off some of the block grants
16	and hope that the people in the City of
17	Scranton that don't have the ability to come
18	down here and get them at least have some
19	idea where the money went.
20	They have one here for Connell
21	Little League park, 5,0000. West Side
22	Neighborhood Association, \$5,000. Friends
23	of the Poor, \$20,000. City of Scranton DPW,
24	I guess that's for paving, \$75,000. City of
25	Scranton, DPW, bridge reconstruction,

1	75,000. Boys and Girls Club, 26,000. West
2	Scranton Little League, 5,000. Helping
3	Northeastern Pennsylvania Initiative,
4	20,000. I guess it has to do with mental
5	health. Friendship House, 25,000.
6	Friendship House again, 125,000. Deutsch
7	Institute, 50,000. United Neighborhood
8	Centers, 67,500. Hyde Park baseball, 5,000.
9	City of Scranton, Department of Public Works
10	and Recreation, 5,000. Scranton Police
11	Department, 350,000. North Scranton Little
12	League, 5,000. City of Scranton Parks and
13	Recreation, 5,000. Weston Park Senior
14	Little League, 5,000. City of Scranton
15	Licensing, Inspection and Writs, 200,000.
16	Community Association of Scranton, 5,000.
17	Scranton Redevelopment Authority 625,000,
18	that's, too, for blight. Common Medical
19	Education Corporation, 100,000. City of
20	Scranton OECD, 300,000. City of Scranton,
21	Section 108 repayment, I assume they were
22	bad loans, a half a million dollars. The
23	City of Scranton
24	MS. FANUCCI: That's incorrect.
25	MR. SBARAGLIA: 600,000. I'm

1	reading them off on here. What it is
2	MS. FANUCCI: Well, then don't make
3	comments. That is not true.
4	MS. SBARAGLIA: I don't want any
5	comments from you. You did enough last
6	time.
7	MS. FANUCCI: Excuse me, don't make
8	comments that aren't true.
9	MR. SBARAGLIA: I'm reading right
10	from here. Are the figures wrong? Maybe
11	my assumptions
12	MS. FANUCCI: No, your personal
13	comments and personal commentary is
14	incorrect. That's what I'm stating.
15	MR. SBARAGLIA: Okay, what's it for?
16	MS. FANUCCI: Keep going. You keep
17	reading your loans, we will talk about it a
18	the end. Bad loans.
19	MR. SBARAGLIA: Catherine McCauley
20	Center, 28,000. Women's Resource Center,
21	30,000. United Neighborhood Centers of
22	Northeastern Pennsylvania, 16,000. Bethel
23	AME, 9,500. Community Intervention Center,
24	20,000. Catholic Social Service of
25	Lackawanna County, 20,000. Catholic Social

2	Catholic Social Service of Lackawanna
3	County, 5,000. Catholic Social Service of
4	Lackawanna County, 10,000, and somewhere
5	Community Housing Development Organization,
6	93,750. Home Administration, 62,500.
7	Homebuyer's program, a quarter of a million.
8	Housing Rehab Program, 218,750.
9	And that's basically all of the
10	figures that were in there, whether my
11	assumption is wrong, yours is right, I have
12	no way of knowing, but I don't like to be
13	interrupted, I don't interrupt you.
14	MS. GATELLI: Mr. Sbaraglia, I just
15	want to say something, that is what was
16	submitted to us and we have all intentions
17	of amending and changing some of that.
18	MR. SBARAGLIA: I was informed of
19	that.
20	MS. GATELLI: We appreciate your
21	input.
22	MR. SBARAGLIA: I was informed on
23	that, that you may change this or that, but
24	I wanted people to actually know
25	MS. GATELLI: The last several years

2	intend to do so with this one also.
3	MS. EVANS: Actually, if after the
4	speakers have finished I could ask
5	Mr. Mitchell and Mrs. Aebli a question, I
6	was going to send a memo about it, but since
7	they are here because they can just answer.
8	MR. MCGOFF: Absolutely. Any other
9	speakers? Ask away?
10	MS. EVANS: Thank you. The only
11	question I had was with regard to the
12	Section 108 repayment loan, and as
13	Mr. Sbaraglia indicated, that is in the
14	amount of \$500,000. I know that it was
15	included last year as well. It was noted
16	last year, however, that the payments were
17	for, I believe it was done singularly, but
18	the payments were for the Hilton Hotel and
19	for the Steamtown Mall. Is that still the
20	case?
21	MS. AEBLI: Yes.
22	MR. MITCHELL: Yes.
23	MS. EVANS: Both
24	MR. MITCHELL: Yeah. There is two
25	payments a year, there is one in February

and one in this August, so I just thought to

make it easier we would just make it a flat

3	number. Last year it was 330,000 and
4	170,000.
5	MS. EVANS: Which is the greater
6	amount, the hotel or the mall?
7	MR. MITCHELL: The mall.
8	MS. EVANS: The mall. And can you
9	tell me, also, for how many more years, in
10	other words, what's the term of that
11	agreement on each of those structures?
12	MR. MITCHELL: I can't tell you off
13	the top of my head, but I could find out for
14	you.
15	MS. EVANS: I'd appreciate that if
16	you could send that along. That's all I
17	had.
18	MR. MCGOFF: Anyone else? I now
19	declare this public hearing closed.
