2	MS. SCHUMACHER: Yes. I'd just like
3	assurance from you that the planning
4	department has reviewed what's been done up
5	there and the city engineer has reviewed the
6	actual work and that we are not assuming a
7	developer's liability and
8	MR. MCGOFF: I was going to answer
9	that.
10	MS. SCHUMACHER: Go ahead.
11	MR. MCGOFF: We have received from
12	the city engineer, Mr. Swanson, a letter
13	saying that everything was in order and that
14	we may proceed.
15	MS. SCHUMACHER: And there's no
16	liability to the taxpayers then? Okay.
17	Well, if we have a decent engineer that
18	should be accurate.
19	MR. MCGOFF: Yes.
20	MS. SCHUMACHER: Thank you.
21	MR. MCGOFF: Ron Ellman.
22	MR. ELLMAN: I wasn't going to say
23	nothing and then I decided I stood right
24	here or sat out there and listened to people
25	from the subdivision come in here and

1 complain how bad the sewage system was and 2 now we are going to take over a troublesome 3 and problematic venture to relieve the owner, it doesn't make sense. And I talked 4 5 to somebody last week that told me, you 6 know, that nothing has been corrected there. 7 The basin is still overflowing, all of that. I just -- just somebody tell me one 8 9 advantage of taking over this for a dollar, 10 you know? They want to get rid of it. It's 11 like trying to trade-in a used car that's no 12 good, you know. Am I thinking wrong? MR. MCGOFF: All of the things that 13 14 the residents asked to have taken care of 15 were taken care of by the developer. 16 MR. ELLMAN: When I say in the paper 17 last week I made a phone call and they told 18 me it was still -- this is the exact words, it was still problematic. I'm not trying 19 20 to, you know, to be a problem in this, but 21 these people don't pay taxes anyway so why 22 should we assume all of these problems up there. 23 24 MR. COURTRIGHT: Oh, they pay taxes, 25 Ron.

2	MR. COURTRIGHT: They pay taxes.
3	MR. ELLMAN: I didn't hear you.
4	MR. COURTRIGHT: They pay taxes.
