MS. EVANS: I'd like to call this 1 public hearing to order. Roll call, please. 2 3 MS. CARRERA: Mr. McGoff. 4 MR. MCGOFF: Here. MS. CARRERA: 5 Mr. Rogan. MR. ROGAN: Here. 6 7 MS. CARRERA: Mr. Loscombe. 8 MR. LOSCOMBE: Here. 9 MS. CARRERA: Mr. Joyce. MR. JOYCE: Here. 10 MS. CARRERA: 11 Mrs. Evans. 12 MS. EVANS: Here. Notice is hereby 13 given that Scranton City Council will hold a 14 public hearing on Tuesday, July 12, 2011, at 6 p.m. in council chambers, second floor 15 16 municipal building, 340 North Washington 17 Avenue in Scranton, Pennsylvania. The 18 purpose of said public hearing is to hear 19 testimony and discuss the following: 20 File of Council No. 40, 2011, 21 amending Chapter 332 of the Code of the City 22 of Scranton titled Parks and Recreation by 23 adding Article III, "West Scranton Skate 24 Park Facilities Rules and Regulations."

Is there anyone who cares to address

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council?

MS. SCHUMACHER: Marie Schumacher.

I understand the backup -- the resolution of the regulations that are being inserted into the city code weren't in there, so could you read what the regs are for us? If it's not too long. And what is the address of the West Scranton Skate Park?

MS. EVANS: It is located at North Bromley Avenue and Jackson Street.

These will be the facility rules:

Park is open Monday through Saturday 12 p.m.

to 8 p.m. or at dusk. Sunday the park is

open is 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. or at dusk. The

facility a closed when equipment ramp

surface is wet, icy, snow covered or as

deemed necessary for safety reasons.

All skaters under the age of 18 must wear at all times an ANSI or Snell approved safety helmet with chin strap secured. Knee pads, elbow pads, gloves, close-toed shoes and wrist braces are strongly suggested.

All skaters must provide their own skating equipment.

Skating into and out of the park is

prohibited. All skates and skateboards must be carried into and out of the park. Any and all types of bicycles and scooters are prohibited in the skate and basketball areas.

An adult must accompany skaters under the age of ten at all times.

It is recommended that skaters use only the equipment that is appropriate for their skill level.

Recklessness will not be tolerated.

All skaters must use this facility
responsibly to avoid injury to themselves or
to others.

The use of proper skater etiquette is expected at all times. Profanity or obscene language is prohibited. Persons violating this rule will be removed from the park and skating privileges revoked.

Use of illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco products is prohibited. Violators will be prosecuted.

Food or drink is prohibited in the skating areas. All trash must be placed in the appropriate trash receptacles.

Use of the portable radios, CD players, car stereos or any other electronic device that produces amplified sound is prohibited at this facility. Personal music devices such as an I-pod or MP3 player are permitted provided headphones are used.

No loitering or trespassing will be tolerated after the park is closed and will result in criminal charges.

Destroying or defacing public property is prohibited and will result in criminal charges.

In addition, skateboarding is an inherently hazardous recreational activity and, therefore, the City of Scranton and its agents may not be held liable for claims of negligence resulting in skateboarder's injuries. All users must comply with posted facility rules and park rules and regulations as defined in the City of Scranton Code 322 public use of parks.

The success of this facility lies in the hands of it's users. Please be respectful of the rules as well as the staff that are responsible for enforcing them.

Individuals found violating the rules of the park will be reported to the Scranton Police Department.

And I believe this backup would have been provided, Ms. Schumacher, when the ordinance was originally introduced in Fifth Order.

MS. SCHUMACHER: Okay. Thank you.

Is there an attendant in that skate area and is it locked when it when it's not -- the hours are being open?

MS. EVANS: I believe, yes, it will be locked and when it not in use, and obviously, according to the backup I just read, there will be staff present at the park at all times.

MS. SCHUMACHER: Okay. Thank you.

MS. EVANS: You're welcome. Is there anyone else who cares to address council?

MS. FOSTER: Good evening, Karin
Foster, West Scranton resident. I'm just
coming up today to let you know that we have
been implementing most of these rules for
the past two months to give the children and

adults that are using the park an opportunity to get used to the idea that they can't do just what they want to do with the exception of enforcing the helmet rule. They are aware that as of the passing of this law that they will be required, and that bicycles that have been currently using the ramps will no longer be able do so, and the scooters.

So far the response has been very positive and I think that they will be a good change for the community. Thank you.

MS. EVANS: Absolutely. Thank you.

Is there anyone else who cares to address
council?

MR. JACKOWITZ: Bill Jackowitz. I just have a couple of questions. First of all, the skate park, is it going to be under the control of Parks and Recreation, parks and Recreation Authority? They would be the ones in charge of the park?

MS. EVANS: Oh, the Recreation

Authority? No. This will not fall under
the Recreation Authority.

MR. JACKOWITZ: Okay, who will it

fall under?

MS. EVANS: Well, obviously, violations have to be reported to and enforced by the Scranton Police Department who I believe also has located it's West Scranton satellite office directly inside of that park, and I believe that the city's Parks and Recreation Department will probably be the employees who would be maintaining the park along with the crime watch facility.

MR. JACKOWITZ: I understand the crime watch, I mean, I'm totally in favor of it, I just wanted to know who was going to overall in charge of the parks, so basically it would be the city and parks and recreation and with the backup being the Neighborhood Association, is my understanding correct?

MR. LOSCOMBE: Yes.

MS. EVANS: Yes, actually, the neighborhood association -- well, I believe the Crime Watch Association comprised of over 100 neighbors in West Scranton and they have been working very hard on this park for

a period of months and actually supervising the activities that have been ongoing daily and they have been doing a very good job of such and it's my understanding that they would be continue to do so and that they would be locking the facility each evening.

MR. JACKOWITZ: Yeah, I heard that, because my concern is I just don't want the Park and Recreation Authority to have anything at all to do with it.

MS. EVANS: No, they do not. They do not.

MR. JACKOWITZ: Thank you.

MS. EVANS: You are welcome.

MR. LOSCOMBE: I've gone by several evenings, it looks like you are doing quite a bit of business there. I think these three girls here with their whips in their hands up there, I think that sort of helps maintain it, but I think it's fantastic. It appears that a lot of the children are utilizing the facilities and you are doing a good job up there. I haven't heard of any problems or complaints, so keep up the good work.

MS. EVANS: And if I might add, I think that this type of facility is long overdue. Having taught in high school and intermediate school for many years I'm aware that skateboarding has become an increasingly popular activity among youngsters and as a result they very often are forced to skateboard on streets and sidewalks throughout the city and I think this provides a location where they can go without disturbing others and certainly enjoy themselves, it's a very healthy activity, and I think it's something we would like to see more of in the city.

Is there anyone else who would like to address council? This public hearing is adjourned.
