Once again, we have no names on the sign-in sheet, so if anyone cares to address council you can approach the podium.

MR. PASCALE: Good evening. My name is a Greg Pascale, I'm the attorney representing Posh Restaurant Group. This group is the same owners of the owners of the Colonnade and we have an agreement of sale to purchase the liquor license.

Because it's coming from a different municipality to Scranton, we need municipal approval for it, which is the reason we are here. I'd like to have my client, Joshua Mast, address council and explain what they are doing with the license.

MR. MAST: Good evening, Council.

MS. EVANS: Good evening.

MR. MAST: As Greg mentioned, we are also the owners of the Colonnade. We are opening up a second location in the Scranton Club that was sold about a year ago to a group of investors. We have leased the

first, second and third floor. We will be opening it up to the public for the first time in 106 years.

On the main floor we will be opening up what was the club/bar restaurant and lounge to the public. Restaurant will be open Tuesday through Sunday, bar and lounge will be open Thursday, Friday and Saturday. On the second floor there are two events spaces where we would could do events of up to 300 where now at the Colonnade we are turning business away because we can only accommodate up to 120 there, and on the top floor we have 14 offices.

So we are very excited about bringing business, business tax revenue, bringing jobs to downtown Scranton and kind of restoring this, again, property that had fallen on some hard times. Again, we have invested close to 200,000 -- we have alone of up to \$200,000 to invest in the property to, again, you know, make it the way that we want it to be.

The landlord has also made significant investments in the property, all

new electrical, all new sprinkler system, as you can already see it's been landscaped, it's had a new paint job put on it. We had a job fair this past weekend, we had over 50 applicants come out and I have to say probably 90 percent of them were hirable applicants that we can work with and train.

We are very excited about this new opportunity and offering this new type of business in Scranton to continue to build the downtown living and life-style here.

MS. EVANS: Thank you, and I must commend you on the renovation of the Colonnade. It is absolutely magnificent and quite an addition to the City of Scranton, so we wish you well with your newest venture.

MR. PASCALE: Any question?

MS. EVANS: I have none. Thank you.

MR. MAST: Thank you.

MR. LOSCOMBE: Just on a quick question, Attorney Pascale, and it has nothing to do with the -- are you leasing the whole building, the offices and everything?

MR. MAST: We are leasing the top three floors. The club, the Scranton Club, still exists and it's on the lowest level that we are calling now the club level, and that space has basically been redone for the club members. We are hoping to work with them to slowly hopefully build up that club again. It will never probably be the 600 members that it was, but, you know, to help them build their membership, but also just give the property back to the community, you know, a beautiful property that we have in downtown.

MR. LOSCOMBE: Excellent. Lots of luck.

MS. EVANS: Is there anyone else who would like to address council? This public hearing is adjourned.
