3	sisters, we gather today realizing the
4	fact that God is the giver of all good
5	gifts and as we begin this new year of
6	2012 let us call upon him with faith
7	and thanksgiving for the
8	reorganization of the members of the
9	our City Council. Let us begin by
10	praying for our great nation of these
11	United States; for our president,
12	Barack Obama; the Congress and all
13	duly elected national officials in the
14	executive, legislative and judicial
15	governance of our country. We pray,
16	too, for our State of Pennsylvania,
17	for its governor, the Honorable Tom
18	Corbett and all the duly elected state
19	officials. We pray also for this
20	great City of Scranton now in its
21	130th year of existence, for our
22	mayor, the Honorable Christopher
23	Doherty, and for all who assist him in
24	looking after the welfare of our
25	citizens. And now we ask God's

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1	blessing upon us and our deliberations
2	for this day and the reorganization of
3	our wonderful City Council, all this
4	through Christ our Lord. Amen.
5	MS. KRAKE: In accordance with
6	the Home Rule Charter of the City of
7	Scranton designating the first Monday
8	of January as the date for city
9	council to reorganize, I hereby call
10	this 2012 organization meeting to
11	order. Roll call, please.
12	MS. MARCIANO: Mr. McGoff.
13	MR. MCGOFF: Here.
14	MS. MARCIANO: Mr. Rogan.
15	MR. ROGAN: Here.
16	MS. MARCIANO: Mr. Loscombe.
17	MR. LOSCOMBE: Here.
18	MS. MARCIANO: Mr. Joyce.
19	MR. JOYCE: Here.
20	MS. MARCIANO: Mrs. Evans.
21	MS. EVANS: Here.
22	MS. KRAKE: At this time I would
23	like excuse me. I need to announce
24	that the swearing in of the city
25	controller will happen at the end of

1	our agenda per her request. At this
2	time I would like to ask that as
3	people are called to the podium to be
4	sworn in, it would be appreciated if
5	the judges and elected officials would
6	then sign the documents that Jamie
7	will have ready for you when you are
8	through with any comments you may
9	have.
10	I have before me the Certificates
11	of Election of Jack Loscombe and
12	Robert E. McGoff as city council
13	persons. Will the council adopt a
14	motion to the effect that the
15	certificates be received and ordered,
16	filed and made a part of the minutes.
17	MR. ROGAN: I so move.
18	MR. JOYCE: I second the motion.
19	MS. KRAKE: On the question?
20	(No response.)
21	MS. KRAKE: All those in favor
22	signify by saying aye.
23	MS. EVANS: Aye.
24	MR. JOYCE: Aye.

5	MS. KRAKE: The ayes have it and
6	so ordered.
7	I will now ask the Honorable
8	Judge Terrence Nealon to step forward
9	to the podium and administer the oath
10	the office to Jack Loscombe for the
11	elected office of city council.
12	MR. LOSCOMBE: I'd like to have
13	my family approach. Don't forget the
14	Bible.
15	(John Loscombe, sworn.)
16	JUDGE TERRENCE NEALON:
17	Congratulations.
18	MS. KRAKE: I would now ask the
19	Honorable Judge William Nealon if he
20	would step forward to the podium to
21	administer the oath of office to
22	Robert E. McGoff for elected office of
23	city council.
24	JUDGE WILLIAM NEALON: I would
25	just like to say I would like to thank

1	Bob McGoff and the whole family.
2	We've been friends and neighbors for
3	many, many years and even closer than
4	that, his good wife happens to have
5	the maiden name of Nealon so I have a
6	double reason for being happy here.
7	But I don't know if you heard but Mr.
8	McGoff said, "Hi, Red, to me." At one
9	time I had red hair.
10	MR. MCGOFF, SR.: A lot of it,
11	too.
12	JUDGE WILLIAM NEALON: My wife
13	still calls me Red. And whenever
14	we're out with a crowd and meeting
15	them for the first time and she's Red
16	this and Red that. When they usually

21	Terrence Nealon.
22	JUDGE TERRENCE NEALON: And I'd
23	like to thank Janet for the privilege
24	of allowing me to administer her oath
25	for her again and also thank Jack as

2	we had some grandchildren around this
3	here but this might be a little
4	more
5	MS. EVANS: My son is babysitting
6	his children today. His wife is
7	working.
8	(Janet Evans, sworn.)
9	JUDGE TERRENCE NEALON:
10	Congratulations.
11	MS. KRAKE: I will now ask
12	Councilman Joyce to come forward to
13	the podium to be sworn in as Council
14	Vice President by the Honorable Judge
15	Terrence Nealon.
16	(Frank Joyce, sworn.)
17	JUDGE TERRENCE NEALON: Again I'd
18	like to thank Frank. Frank and I had
19	the pleasure of running together two
20	years ago when I ran for retention.
21	(Frank Joyce, sworn.)
22	JUDGE TERRENCE NEALON:
23	Congratulations.
24	MR. LOSCOMBE: I would now like
25	to ask Judge Terrence Nealon to come

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1	back up to the podium. We're keeping
2	you busy today and have Nancy Krake
3	join him to be sworn in as our City
4	Clerk.
5	JUDGE TERRENCE NEALON: I usually
6	run Lake Scranton but I won't have to
7	today. I'll be able to take a pass.
8	(Nancy Krake, sworn.)
9	MR. LOSCOMBE: I would now ask
10	that Mrs. Janet Tomko Evans take over
11	as permanent chairman and President of
12	Scranton City Council. That was a
13	rough ten minute stint.
14	MS. EVANS: Thank you. And it
15	was relaxing for me.
16	We are now ready to consider the
17	Rules of Procedure by which this
18	council will be governed during the
19	next two years. What is your
20	pleasure?
21	MR. MCGOFF: I move that the
22	rules of council be adopted by
23	Resolution No. 1, 2012, as required by
24	the Home Rule Charter.
25	MR. JOYCE: Second.

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1	MS. EVANS: Mrs. Krake, would you
2	read Resolution No. 1.
3	MS. KRAKE: Resolution No. 1,
4	2012, adopting the rules and order of
5	business of the Scranton City Council,
6	Scranton, Pennsylvania.
7	MS. EVANS: On the question?
8	MR. ROGAN: Yes, on the question.
9	I will be voting no on the council
10	rules only because I do disagree with
11	the August recess that is written into
12	the rules.
13	MS. EVANS: Is there anyone else
14	on the question?
15	(No response.)
16	MS. EVANS: All those in favor
17	signify by saying aye.
18	MS. EVANS: Aye.
19	MR. JOYCE: Aye.
20	MR. MCGOFF: Aye.
21	MR. LOSCOMBE: Aye.
22	MS. EVANS: Opposed?
23	MR. ROGAN: No.
24	MS. EVANS: The ayes have it and
25	so ordered.

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1	The following will be the
2	committee chairpersons for the next
3	two years: Community Development, Pat
4	Rogan; Public Works, Bob McGoff;
5	Public Safety, Jack Loscombe; Finance,
6	Frank Joyce; Rules, Janet Evans.
7	Subcommittees: Pension Review
8	Administration, Bob McGoff; Downtown
9	Revitalization, Jack Loscombe; Boards
10	and Commissions, Pat Rogan;
11	Revenues/Taxes, Frank Joyce;
12	Intergovernmental Relations, Janet
13	Evans. I will now call on each
14	council member for a few brief
15	remarks.
16	Mr. McGoff, do you have any
17	remarks at this time?
18	MR. MCGOFF: Thank you. First, I
19	would like to, you know, thank the
20	three gentlemen that flank me here for
21	the swearing in, three people for whom
22	I have the greatest respect.
23	Judge Nealon, thank you very
24	much. It was indeed an honor to have
25	you here today to do that and I

1	greatly appreciate it. My grandson,
2	Ryan, was also here. Ryan voted in
3	his first election in November, and
4	I'm very proud to have him with me
5	today to be part of this ceremony, and
6	most of all a thanks to my dad, Bob,
7	Sr. I get very emotional. I really
8	appreciate you being here and again
9	being part of this, and I hope you're
10	here if it happens again. And also a
11	thanks to my family that came today
12	and also my campaign chairman and his
13	wife for being here and friends of the
14	family who helped during this process
15	of getting elected, and lastly a thank
16	you to the voters of the City of
17	Scranton for placing their trust in me
18	to do this job for another four years,
19	and also a congratulations to all
20	those who were sworn in today and
21	hopefully this year will be a year of
22	progress and moving forward with the
23	development of the City of Scranton.
24	And thank you.
25	(Applause.)

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1	MS. EVANS: Mr. Rogan, do you
2	have any remarks at this time?
3	MR. ROGAN: Yes, briefly. I
4	would like to congratulate Councilman
5	Loscombe and Councilman McGoff. I
6	know both of them ran a very hard
7	champaign and as somebody and as all
8	of us up here who have run, we
9	understand how difficult it is to run
10	for public office. And especially Mr.
11	Loscombe, it was his first time
12	running and I ran my first time and I
13	actually lost to Mr. McGoff. And I
14	always joke around that I don't feel
15	as bad now after you were a top vote
16	getter in this election that you beat
17	me in my first run. But
18	congratulations to both of them.
19	Congratulations, of course, to Janet
20	Evans being sworn in for president
21	again, Mr. Joyce for taking the vice
22	president spot. I had the privilege
23	of serving as vice president for two
24	years and now it's Mr. Joyce's turn so
25	I wish him the best as well. Also

1	Mrs. Krake and Attorney Hughes, wish
2	both of you the best and
3	congratulations again on another
4	two-year term for both of you. And I
5	hope as Mr. McGoff said that this next
6	year will be a year of progress where
7	we can do, you know, we can move the
8	city in the direction where we help
9	all the people. I think we have done
10	a good job over the first two years,
11	my first two years, and I hope to
12	continue that and continue working for
13	the people. Thank you.
14	(Applause.)
15	MS. EVANS: Mr. Loscombe, do you
16	have any remarks at this time?
17	MR. LOSCOMBE: Yes. Only about a
18	half hour's worth. No. I'll keep it
19	short. I don't have anything
20	prepared. But I, too, would like to
21	thank my family for being here today
22	and for being here with me the past
23	two years through many of the
24	decisions we've had to made and
25	there's been some tough decisions and

1	I did have the support of my family
2	through all of that. And I'm honored
3	to say I have the oldest member of my
4	family here. I won't tell how old,
5	Mom. To the youngest member, my
6	grandsons, Sam and Andrew. I think
7	Andrew is out in the hall right now.
8	So for that I'm honored, and I'm
9	honored to serve here for that reason.
10	But I'd like to thank everyone who
11	supported me in the campaign, who
12	voted for me and it's an honor and a
13	privilege to be able to serve them for
14	another four years.
15	Two years ago, I believe it was
16	January 12th of 2010 I received a
17	phone call and I was appointed to this
18	position by my honorable colleagues
19	here, and they took a giant leap of
20	faith when they appointed me. I
21	believe there were 23 of us that
22	applied for the position and, you
23	know, I think some of them have known
24	me through different functions and
25	that but, you know, I've never been

involved politically or anything at that time. So they took a giant leap of faith in appointing me in hoping I did my best for the people in the City of Scranton and to be perfectly honest with you, I was a nervous wreck here that night when I was sworn in. I've become a little more comfortable since But, you know, on a day-to-day then. basis it's an honor to go out and, you know, you run into people on the streets, in the grocery stores and that's what I love about Scranton. You know, they'll come up to you with their concerns. First, they'll apologize, Oh, I don't want to bother you here at dinner, in the store. But I know just like everyone of my colleagues here, we enjoy that. That's what we're here to serve you for and that's how we find out what the issues are on a daily basis out in the street because we're here working for you. People often say this is a part-time job, we're here one night a

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1	week but don't be fooled. You can ask
2	my family. It's a 24-hour job. We
3	get calls, e-mails, concerns at all
4	times of the day and evening, and it's
5	always on our mind but we're
6	passionate about it. You know,
7	sometimes we all don't agree on
8	certain issues but I often say I've
9	been married for 32 years and my wife
10	and I don't agree all the time either
11	and we're still together. We can
12	agree to disagree on issues and I
13	believe our best interest, our hearts
14	are in the responsibility that we have
15	for everyone in the city and this
16	year I mean, well, even last year
17	we have some heavy issues that we have
18	to work on together. And, you know,
19	budgetary wise public safety, you
20	know, that's my committee, and that is
21	a big issue right now. As of
22	January 1st we're down to 100
23	firefighters, we're down on police
24	officers and I just have a great
25	concern on that. But I know together

we are going to work hard to resolve these issues. And I think, you know, that maybe, maybe the mayor and our council can work a little more together. I know the mayor had reached out to Mr. Rogan this past year and prior to the budget he had reached out to me. I hope that's an new opening that he will work together with us and perhaps we will be able to work on something. You know, I have some ideas, maybe a couple members of council. He doesn't want to come to a public meeting. Perhaps we can have a couple members of council meet with him along with the newspaper reporters. At least there's a report of what is going on. We like to keep everything open and transparent but we have to progress this city and we have some pretty hefty issues this year, budgetary issues and it's going to take us all working together for you. That's what we've been trying to do and as you've seen in the past two

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1	years, we've had to make some hard
2	decisions. Nobody likes to cut
3	anybody's jobs or salaries due to
4	economic reasons and reasons I won't
5	go into here, I've gone through them
6	in other meetings with, you know, not
7	following budgetary items and stuff
8	like that. We're in the position that
9	it's worse than it was. And the only
10	way we're going to get any better is
11	if we work a little bit more together.
12	I know we have agendas and we want to
13	get this city moving ahead. And I
14	think with the crew that we have here,
15	I've been very fortunate. They've
16	been my mentors this past two years,
17	they've taught me a lot. I go to them
18	with questions, they ask me questions
19	but they usually have the better
20	answers. But I'm proud to be here
21	with Mr. McGoff, Mr. Rogan, Mrs.
22	Evans, Mr. Joyce, Mrs. Krake and
23	Attorney Hughes and, of course, Jamie
24	from our office here and Cathy who is
25	not here this evening. But I hope to

1	continue the hard work that we've been
2	doing and for 2012 I just hope that
3	things will progress a little bit
4	better, and I know we're all going to
5	be working hard to see that that
6	happens because we have over 70,000
7	people that we're responsible for.
8	And, again, I'm calling for the mayor
9	to cooperate with us and in the best
10	interest of everyone in this city and
11	I'm looking for the next four years.
12	That's all I have to say. Thank you
13	very much. I forgot to mention, I
14	wanted to thank Fr. Joe from St. Ann's
15	for being here and Judges Nealon
16	it's easier to say it that way for
17	giving us the honor of swearing us in
18	here. And, again, Mr. McGoff for
19	running a good campaign, even our
20	candidates in the primary. They're
21	all very good candidates and they have
22	bright futures and I hope they will
23	continue to serve in the best interest
24	of the city and, you know, come up
25	here. I'm an old man so I won't be

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1	here long but thanks to everybody.
2	Thank you.
3	(Applause.)
4	MS. EVANS: Mr. Joyce, do you
5	have any remarks today?
6	MR. JOYCE: Yes. I'd like to
7	begin first by congratulating my
8	colleagues, Councilman Bob McGoff and
9	Councilman Jack Loscombe as well as
10	their challengers for the campaigns
11	that they ran. I think that they all
12	brought out very noteworthy issues and
13	they and my two colleagues sitting
14	here, I'm very confident that they
15	will both do a great job over the next
16	four years. I'd also like to thank
17	Judge Terrence Nealon for swearing me
18	in and also Councilman Rogan for his
19	two years of service as vice
20	president. It will be I will be
21	seeking to follow or fill his shoes
22	over the next two years and also Fr.
23	Joe; our City Clerk, Nancy Krake; our
24	solicitor, Boyd Hughes; and also Jamie
25	and Cathy from our office.

1 Over the past two years it has been an honor and a privilege to serve 2 3 the residents of Scranton. I'd like 4 to thank the residents of Scranton 5 once again for putting me where I am 6 today. I would also like to thank the 7 heroes in the military who continue to 8 fight for our way of life as these men 9 and women allow our government to 10 exist. 11 Finally, I'd like to thank again 12 my family but especially my mother and 13 my late father who I unfortunately 14 lost at an early age and thank both of 15 them over the course of my life, they 16 instilled certain values in me such as 17 to always be honest, to never forget 18 where I came from, to care about 19 others more than myself, to be humble, 20 to work hard and to always give it my 21 all. These core values have guided me 22 through my first two years of service. 23 These core values will continue to 24 guide me in my next two years of 25 service as vice president and finance

1	chair. I will continue to make
2	decisions with the utilitarian
3	approach in making decisions which
4	means the best for all. I will
5	continue to fight for all of the
6	residents of Scranton no matter who
7	they are, whether or not they voted
8	for me and no matter where in the city
9	they are from as everyone in Scranton
10	is equal in my eye. As I look to the
11	future there is much that can be done
12	still to make Scranton a better place
13	to live than it is today. Over the
14	next two years I pledge to put my
15	heart and my soul into making that
16	happen in my capacity as a member of
17	Scranton City Council and also as the
18	Vice President of Scranton City
19	Council. One again thank you all for
20	giving me the opportunity to serve and
21	it has been an honor and a privilege
22	to serve the Scrantonian residents and
23	it always will be and that's all.
24	(Applause.)
25	MS. EVANS: Good morning. This

1	is a day to give thanks for our many,
2	many blessings and to examine our
3	past, present and future as
4	Scrantonians.
5	To begin, Scranton City Council
6	wishes to thank the Honorable Judge
7	William Nealon and his son, the
8	Honorable Terrence Nealon for
9	administering our oaths of office and
10	Fr. Joseph Jones, C.P, Parochial Vicar
11	of St. Ann's Basilica Parish in
12	Scranton for blessing this council,
13	these chambers and all of those in
14	attendance today. We thank all who
15	have taken the time to attend this
16	ceremony, demonstrate your support and
17	wish this council continued success.
18	I particularly want to thank the
19	voters of Scranton who chose to retain
20	this council to insure checks and
21	balances, accountability and physical
22	responsibility in city government. I
23	extend my best wishes to Councilmen
24	McGoff and Jack Loscombe as they enter
25	their new terms in elected office. I

1	also recognize Councilman Pat Rogan
2	for his strong, dedicated service as
3	vice president and I congratulate
4	Councilman Frank Joyce, our newly
5	elected vice president of Scranton
6	City Council whose financial work and
7	commitment to this council earned him
8	this honor. In addition, I thank my

24	understanding and support throughout
25	the best and worse of times.

1 Ladies and gentlemen, your 2 council accomplished many goals and 3 kept its pledges to you in the past 4 two vears. We decreased real estate 5 taxes by ten percent and business 6 taxes by 25 percent for 2011, lowered 7 the bidding threshold and put 8 professional services out to bid in an 9 effort to assist existing businesses 10 and encourage new businesses to locate in Scranton. We ended wasteful, 11 12 frivolous spending of UDAG funds and 13 allocated increased CDBG funding for 14 blight removal, paving and for police and fire vehicles. We hammered out a 15 16 fair contract with Northeast Revenue 17 Service for the collection of 18 delinquent taxes, secured delinquent 19 taxes from wealthy developers, 20 approved state funding for three major 21 redevelopment projects citywide and increased pilot payments to the City 22 23 of Scranton from \$100,000 in 2009 to 24 over \$200,000 in 2010 and 11. We were 25 the first government body to band bath

1	salts and synthetic marijuana in
2	Northeastern Pennsylvania in order to
3	protect our children and youth. We
4	kept workers employed at the Steamtown
5	Mall and exposed financial
6	mismanagement in city government among
7	other achievements. Most recently
8	city council provided a balanced
9	budget which cleared up five lingering
10	city debts, including the SRA, the
11	SPA, federal CDBG monies, borrowing
12	for 2011 unfunded debt and
13	reimbursement of the Workers' Comp
14	reserve funds and full payment of
15	outstanding bills. Equally important
16	this council decreased Mayor Doherty's
17	proposed 29 percent tax increase to a
18	4.8 percent tax increase while
19	providing funding for the
20	reinstatement of 13 firefighters in
21	2012. We opened the lines of
22	communication and forged cooperation
23	with the banking community, the
24	Pennsylvania Economy League, the
25	Department of Community and Economic

Development and the Doherty 1 2 administration. However, our work is 3 not finished. Many challenges lie 4 ahead, particularly the Supreme Court award of tens of millions of dollars 5 6 to Scranton Police and fire, the 7 resulting spike in debt service 8 payments and ultimately removal of 9 distressed status. To meet these 10 formidable challenges, Mayor Doherty, his administration, Scranton City 11 12 Council, the Pennsylvania Economy 13 League and DCED must work jointly to 14 shift the tax burden from our financially oppressed citizens to 15 16 those who use city services without 17 shouldering their fair share. 18 Together we must seek to implement a 19 payroll tax so that big business pays 20 while small business pays less, a 21 commuter tax in order that county 22 residents who enjoy city services 23 share the costs and an amusement tax 24 to slightly increase the price of entertainment for those who can afford 25

1 to attend events. The people of our 2 city cannot shoulder the financial 3 challenges 2012 and 2013 alone. 4 Increasing real estate taxes and 5 cutting manpower will no longer be 6 Rather, new revenue options. 7 generators must be pursued. The 8 success of this plan depends upon the 9 combined cooperative efforts of the 10 Doherty administration, city council 11 and PEL. City council stands ready 12 for the future and is the first to 13 offer its cooperation today to meet 14 our city's challenges. May God bless 15 Scranton and its good people as we 16 move forward in this new year. Thank 17 you. 18 (Applause.) 19 MS. KRAKE: I have before me the 20 Certificate of Election of Roseann 21 Novembrino, city controller. Will the 22 council adopt a motion to the effect 23 that the certificate be received and 24 order filed and made a part of the 25 minutes?

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1	MR. ROGAN: I second the motion.
2	MS. EVANS: We need a council

4	MR. ROGAN: I apologize. I move
5	the motion.
6	MR. JOYCE: I second the motion.
7	MS. EVANS: On the question?
8	(No response.)
9	MS. EVANS: All those in favor
10	signify by saying aye.
11	MS. EVANS: Aye.
12	MR. JOYCE: Aye.
13	MR. ROGAN: Aye.
14	MR. MCGOFF: Aye.
15	MR. LOSCOMBE: Aye.
16	MS. KRAKE: Opposed?
17	(No response.)
18	MS. EVANS: The ayes have it and
19	so moved.
20	MS. KRAKE: I would now ask that
21	the Honorable Judge James J. Walsh
22	step forward to the podium to
23	administer the oath of office to Mrs.
24	Novembrino for the elected Office of
25	City Controller.

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1	(Roseann Novembrino, sworn.)
2	MS. NOVEMBRINO: Honorable
3	judges, honorable council, I feel so
4	privileged to be standing here today.
5	I realize once again I have received
6	the wealth and support of my wonderful
7	family, friends and the people of
8	Scranton who have always year after
9	year supported me. Next to my love of
10	God, family and friends comes the love
11	of my great city. As controller, I
12	will continue an open door policy, I
13	will always, always be available to
14	the people of Scranton. I want to be
15	part of a positive process that will
16	insure the city's future. I will
17	continue to work hard to keep your
18	trust and make you proud. I
19	understand as separate bodies of
20	government we may disagree from
21	time-to-time but our disagreements
22	should be resolved as quickly as
23	possible for the people of Scranton,
24	that common sense and common courtesy
25	prevail. May we keep our eyes on the

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1	builders and the planner of Scranton
2	and people who come into our city with
3	dreams and want to obtain them and
4	obtain their goals to make our city a
5	better place.
6	At this time I would like to
7	congratulate Councilman McGoff and
8	Jack Loscombe and I hope you have a
9	wonderful four years ahead of you.
10	And, of course, to my staff who are
11	always, always there for me. And I'm
12	so honored to have everyone here today
13	and thank you so very much. Thank
14	you.
15	(Applause.)
16	MR. LOSCOMBE: Congratulations to
17	you, too, Mrs. Novembrino.
18	MR. JOYCE: Congratulations.
19	MR. ROGAN: Congratulations.
20	MS. EVANS: Congratulations. I
21	will now call for a motion to adjourn.
22	MR. LOSCOMBE: So moved.
23	MR. ROGAN: Second.
24	MS. EVANS: This meeting is
25	adjourned. There being no further

1	business, our next regularly scheduled
2	meeting is be held on Thursday,
3	January 12th, 2012, at 6:30 p.m.
4	Thank you all for attending today.
5	Please stand for the benediction.
6	FR. JONES: Eternal loving God
7	source of every good gift, we thank
8	you for being with us this day in
9	these deliberations as we move forward
10	for the best of our city. We ask you
11	special blessings now on our
12	reorganized city council members.
13	Help them, Lord, to use their talents
14	for the good of this city and all its
15	inhabitants. Guide them in all their
16	deliberations and may they continue to
17	promote through peace and justice
18	among all our residents. May they
19	always be protective of the integrity
20	of creation and the natural resources
21	entrusted to their care. May they be
22	sensitive to the needs of the poor and
23	the unemployed. May they be vigilant
24	in looking after the welfare of our
25	children as well as our elderly. May

1 they continue to be supportive of new 2 ventures, in improved education and 3 health care systems and may they be 4 open to the rich diversity of cultural and religious traditions already in 5 our mist. And finally, Lord, may they 6 7 all be enabled by your powerful 8 protection to discharge their duties 9 with honesty and integrity and may we, 10 their fellow citizens pledge them our 11 loyalty, our prayers and our support 12 as they strive to fulfill the duties 13 of their offices for the common good 14 of this great city.
