There is no occupied residences on that block. 15 MS. SCHUMACHER: Both sides? 16 17 MR. EVANS: Yeah. 18 MS. SCHUMACHER: Thank you. MR. EVANS: You're welcome. 19 20 MR. ROGAN: Is there anyone else who 21 would like to address council? 22 MS. HODOWANITZ: Joan Hodowanitz. 23 If I recall, I used to work at Moses Taylor 24 Hospital and the 700 block of Monroe 25 includes Temple Israel and the Moses Taylor

parking garage and it was a -- it was a nuisance for Temple Israel, I know that when they would have services that there is permit parking there and they have many disabled and elderly that have a need to have unrestricted parking to access Temple Israel so I think you know that this is a good move.

MR. ROGAN: Temple Israel is actually the group that made the request.

MS. HODOWANITZ: I can understand why they did.

MR. ROGAN: Thank you. Is there anyone else who would like to address council on this issue? If not, this public hearing is adjourned.
