Independent Auditor's Report

We examined the accompanying Forms MS-965 With Adjustments for the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund of the City of Scranton, Lackawanna County, for the period January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2017. The municipality's management is responsible for presenting the Forms MS-965 in accordance with the criteria set forth in Note 1. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the Forms MS-965 With Adjustments based on our examination.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the standards applicable to attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the examination to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Forms MS-965 are presented in accordance with the criteria described above, in all material respects. An examination involves performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Forms MS-965. The nature, timing and extent of the procedures selected depend on our judgement, including an assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the Forms MS-965, whether due to fraud or error. We believe that the evidence we obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

We are mandated by Section 403 of *The Fiscal Code*, 72 P.S. § 403, to audit each municipality's Liquid Fuels Tax Fund to ensure that funds received are expended in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States include attestation engagements as a separate type of audit. An attestation engagement performed pursuant to *Government Auditing Standards* involves additional standards that exceed the standards provided by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Accordingly, this attestation engagement complies with both *Government Auditing Standards* and Section 403 of *The Fiscal Code*.

As described in Note 4, the adjustments included on the Forms MS-965 With Adjustments are made by the Department of the Auditor General.

Independent Auditor's Report (Continued)

In our opinion, the Forms MS-965 With Adjustments present, in all material respects, the information required by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund of the City of Scranton, Lackawanna County, for the period January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2017, in accordance with the criteria set forth in Note 1.

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we are required to report all deficiencies that are considered to be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in internal control; fraud and noncompliance with provisions of laws or regulations that have a material effect on the Forms MS-965; and any other instances that warrant the attention of those charged with governance; noncompliance with provisions of contracts or grant agreements, and abuse that has a material effect on the Forms MS-965. We are also required to obtain and report the views of responsible officials concerning the findings, conclusions, and recommendations, as well as any planned corrective actions. We performed our examination to express an opinion on whether the Forms MS-965 are presented in accordance with the criteria described above and not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on internal control over reporting on the Forms MS-965 or on compliance and other matters; accordingly, we express no such opinions.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Forms MS-965 will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over reporting on the Forms MS-965 was for the limited purpose of expressing an opinion on whether the Forms MS-965 are presented in accordance with the criteria described above and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our engagement we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Forms MS-965 are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of the City of Scranton, Lackawanna County's compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of amounts on the Forms MS-965. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our engagement, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards. However, we did note a matter that, while not required to be included in this report by Government Auditing Standards, has been included in the finding below:

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CITY OF SCRANTON LACKAWANNA COUNTY LIQUID FUELS TAX FUND BACKGROUND FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2016 TO DECEMBER 31, 2017

Background

The Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law, Act 655 of 1956, as amended, (72 P.S. § 2615.5 et sec.), provides municipalities other than counties (townships, boroughs, cities, towns, home rule, and optional plan governments) with an annual allocation of liquid fuels taxes from the state's Motor License Fund to be used for the maintenance and repair of streets, roads, and bridges for which the municipality is responsible. The allocation of these funds to municipalities is based: (1) 50 percent on the municipality's proportion of local road mileage to the total local road mileage in the state, and (2) 50 percent on the proportion of a municipality's population to the total population in the state.

The Vehicle Code, Title 75 P.S. § 9511, provides municipalities with annual maintenance payments to be received from the Motor License Fund for functionally local highways that were transferred to a municipality from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Each municipality must deposit the allocation of Liquid Fuels Tax funds and annual maintenance payments that it receives into a special fund called either the Municipal Liquid Fuels Tax Fund or State Fund. A municipality may not deposit any other monies into this fund except when the municipality does not have enough money in the special fund to meet the payments called for by its current annual budget for road and bridge purposes. In such a case, the municipality may borrow money or transfer money from its General Fund to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The Department of Transportation has been given the regulatory authority for the administration of these funds. Department of Transportation's *Publication 9* includes the policies and procedures for the administration of Act 655, as amended, and the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money. However, if there is a difference between *Publication 9* and any legislation, the legislation shall govern.

To qualify for the annual allocation of Liquid Fuels Tax funds, *Publication 9* indicates that each municipality shall:

- 1. Submit annual reports (MS-965, Actual Use Report, MS-965P, Project and Miscellaneous Receipts, and MS-965S, Record of Checks).
- 2. Make deposits and payments or expenditures in compliance with Act 655 of 1956, as amended. Failure to do so may result in not receiving allocations from PennDOT until all discrepancies are resolved. *Publication 9*, Section 2.6, includes information about investing Liquid Fuels Tax monies, using loan or bond proceeds, and types of receipts into the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

- 3. Submit the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Report of Elected and Appointed Officials by January 31st and the Survey of Financial Condition By March 15th.
- 4. Ensure resolution of all Contractor Responsibility Program (CRP) holds and blocks imposed by the Department of Revenue and the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 5. Ensure resolution of all reimbursements required as a result of audits performed by the Department of the Auditor General or monitoring reviews performed by the Department of Transportation's Financial Consultants.

Section 3

This section of Form MS-965 With Adjustments determines if the municipality expended Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money in excess of the permissible amount for equipment and the balance that the municipality may carry forward for the purchase of equipment to the subsequent year.

Department of Transportation *Publication 9* requires that the amount expended for equipment purchases in a given year not exceed the sum of the equipment balance carried forward from the previous year and 20 percent of the current year's Liquid Fuels Tax Fund allocation and, if applicable, 20 percent of the turnback allocation plus other Department of Transportation approved adjustments.

If the municipality spent in excess of the amount listed on Line 4, the excess must be reimbursed to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The equipment balance to be carried forward for the subsequent year is the lesser of the amount on Line 6 or the ending fund balance on Line 6 of Section 2, but not less than zero.

Basis Of Presentation

The financial activities of the municipality are accounted for in separate funds. The Liquid Fuels Tax Fund is used to account for state aid revenues from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation used primarily for building and improving local roads and bridges. The Forms MS-965 have been prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation as a result of the Fuels Tax Act 655, dated 1956 and as amended, which does not constitute a complete presentation of the entity's assets, liabilities, expenses, and fund balance. Accordingly, the presentation of Forms MS-965 With Adjustments is restricted to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund, which represents a segment of the entity.

1. Criteria (Continued)

Basis Of Accounting

The accompanying Forms MS-965 With Adjustments are prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. Under this method, revenues are recognized when received and expenditures are recorded when paid.

General Fixed Assets

General fixed assets are recognized as expenditures at the time of purchase. No depreciation has been provided on the heavy equipment used to maintain and repair roads and bridges.

2. Deposits

The Third Class City Code, Title 53 P.S. § 36804.1, authorizes the city to deposit its funds in the following:

- Deposits in savings accounts or time deposits, other than certificates of deposit
 or share accounts, of institutions having their principal place of business in the
 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance
 Corporation (FDIC) or other like insurance. For any amount above the insured
 maximum, the depository shall pledge approved collateral.
- Certificates of deposit purchased from institutions insured by the FDIC or other like insurance to the extent that such accounts are so insured. For any amounts in excess of the insured maximum, such deposits shall be collateralized by a pledge or assignment of assets. Certificates of deposit may not exceed 20 percent of a bank's total capital surplus or 20 percent of a savings and loan or savings bank's assets minus liabilities.

Deposits consist of receipts and deposits in financial institutions. Pennsylvania statutes require all deposits to be insured and, for any amount above the insured maximum, to be secured with approved collateral as defined.

2. Deposits (Continued)

There were no deposits exposed to custodial credit risk as of December 31, 2017. Custodial credit risk, as defined by GASB No. 40, as amended, includes deposits that are not covered by depository insurance and the deposits are uncollateralized, collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution, or collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution's trust department or agent but not in the municipality's name.

3. Interest On Investments

Our examination disclosed that the municipality deposited idle liquid fuels tax money in interest-bearing accounts which earned \$5,162.62 during 2016, and \$3,316.13 during 2017, thus providing additional funds for road maintenance and repairs.

An adjustment of \$(398.80) was made to "Miscellaneous" because a transfer between two Liquid Fuels Tax Fund accounts was incorrectly reported as an expenditure.

2017 - Section 2

An adjustment of \$(398.80) was made to "Miscellaneous" because a transfer between two Liquid Fuels Tax Fund accounts was incorrectly reported as a receipt.

6. Bank Loan

On September 1, 2003, the municipality borrowed 12,400,000.00 from Penn Security Bank for the East Mountain Road Project. Of the \$12,400,000.00, \$282,000.00 is eligible to be paid from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. The term of the loan was for 28 years at an interest rate of 4.33 percent. Prior years' principal payments from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund were \$90,074.58. Additionally, the municipality paid principal of \$3,666,160.43 and interest of \$3,764,725.90 from the General Fund.

During the current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$3,426,968.76 and interest of \$1,156,968.76 from the General Fund. The outstanding balance of the loan as of December 31, 2017, was \$5,216,796.23, plus interest. The outstanding balance of the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund portion of the loan as of December 31, 2017, was \$191,925.42.

7. Bank Loan

On August 1, 2014, the municipality borrowed \$7,500,000.00 from J.P. Morgan to purchase the city's street lights. Of the \$7,500,000.00 borrowed, \$4,469,009.42 or 59.59 percent of the loan is eligible to be paid from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. The term of the loan was for 25 years at a variable interest rate. Prior years' principal and interest payments from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund were \$1,303,370.50 and \$987,101.62, respectively. Additionally, the municipality paid principal of \$1,501,629.50 and interest of \$1,277,103.64 from the General Fund.

During the current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$590,000.00 and interest of \$249,244.26 from the General Fund. The outstanding balance of the loan as of December 31, 2017, was \$4,105,000.00, plus interest. The outstanding balance of the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund portion of the loan as of December 31, 2017, was \$3,165,638.92.

8. Bank Loan

On December 1, 2015, the municipality borrowed \$2,242,820.00 from Pennsylvania Infrastructure Bank for paving projects. The term of the loan was for ten years at an interest rate of 1.625 percent. Principal and interest payments of \$244,811.66 are due annually.

During the current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$420,117.61 and interest of \$69,505.71 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. These amounts are reflected in highway construction and rebuilding projects on the 2016 and 2017 Forms MS-965 – Section 1. The outstanding balance of the loan as of December 31, 2017 was \$1,822,702.39, plus interest.

9. Lease-Purchase Agreement

On October 24, 2016, the municipality entered into a \$4,000,000.00 lease-purchase agreement with M&T Bank for the upgrading of city owned street lights to LED light fixtures and the painting of some existing poles. The agreement was for a term of 10 years at an interest rate of 3.50 percent. Principal and interest payments are due annually.

During the current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$321,796.64 and interest of \$73,678.36 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. These amounts are reflected on the highway construction and rebuilding projects 2017 Form MS-965 - Section 1. The outstanding balance of the lease-purchase agreement as of December 31, 2017 was \$3,678,203.36, plus interest.

CITY OF SCRANTON LACKAWANNA COUNTY LIQUID FUELS TAX FUND FINDING AND RECOMMENDATION FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2016 TO DECEMBER 31, 2017

Finding - Nonpermissible Expenditure

Our examination disclosed that the municipality expended \$22,550.00 during 2016 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund for decorative street lighting in the park, which is a nonpermissible expenditure.

The Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law, 72 P.S. § 2615.4, provides, in part, that monies herein allocated may be used only for construction, reconstruction, maintenance, and repairs of such public roads or streets, including bridges, culverts and drainage structures, for which they are legally responsible. Also permitted are expenditures involving acquisition, maintenance, repairs and operation of street signs, traffic signs, traffic signal control systems, road equipment, and snow fences.

The Department of Transportation has been statutorily authorized to promulgate regulations concerning the administration of Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money and has determined that certain items, including decorative street lighting in a park, are outside the scope of permissible expenditures.

On May 26, 2016, the municipality reimbursed \$22,550.00 to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

Recommendation

We recommend that, in the future, the municipality complies with the Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law and the Department of Transportation's Regulations regarding permissible expenditures.

Management's Response

The municipal officials offered no formal response at this time.

Auditor's Conclusion

During our next examination we will determine if the municipality complied with our recommendation.
