Kellie and I actually decided it might be a good idea for me to take the gavel and maybe use it at home. So we'll see how that works out.

I want to thank my parents who are

here today, Jack and Marie. They are my biggest supporters in everything that I do. I am so very proud of them. My dad -- I'm so proud of him for, number one, being a great father and a United States Marine and my mom for being the most compassionate, understanding person that I've ever met.

I want to thank my brother Lenny and Katie for being here and all of their support.

I also have to thank my father and mother-in-law Jim and Mari Wright who are here.

I want to thank the amazing aunts and uncles that I have who have always been there for me.

As you know, I mentioned on this

Council my Uncle Billy and my and Uncle John

were going through a great battle with cancer.

And the community stepped up for them as the

community does for everyone who is going

through great challenges like that.

I could remember each time I ran for office my Uncle John accompanied me. We had some great times walking the streets of Scranton. And I just appreciate everything that my aunts and uncles have done for me.

I also today am thinking of my

grandparents, Bill and Elizabeth Gaughan and Helen and Edward Trently. I'm thinking of my wife's grandmother, Mary McLane. They were all involved in one way or another in politics. And they all loved this City.

And I think that they would be thrilled today to see all of these great people here, a new Mayor in Paige Cognetti and our willingness to work together to make this City the greatest City, not only in northeastern Pennsylvania but in the country.

I want to thank my colleagues for putting their faith in me to lead this Council as President over the next two years. Mr. McAndrew, Dr. Rothchild, congratulations on your victory. I want to thank Councilman Rogan for his leadership as President over the last two years and his friendship and also Councilman Donahue for his friendship and leadership over the last two years.

I promise to do my duties as Council President with honesty and integrity. We're always putting the people first. This past year as all of you in this room have known, has been a very difficult time for our City.

The people of Scranton were dealt a devastating blow that shook their faith and confidence in government and elected officials to its absolute core. People in Scranton and in this region are physically and mentally exhausted from corruption.

I'm here to say that today is a new day. Today is our chance to put all of this behind us and to begin to write a new chapter for the City of Scranton, a chapter that is built on a foundation of openness, transparency, accountability, and honesty.

We currently face many challenges that at some times may seem insurmountable.

But it's my belief that with great challenges comes great opportunity. Now is not the time to shy away from being in public service.

Now is not the time to say leave it up to somebody else, one person can't make a difference. There's no hope and the job is too hard. From the School Board to Council to our new County Commissioners, a new generation of leaders must stand up and fight for the City that we all love so much.

Senator Robert F. Kennedy made a

speech in South Africa in 1966 where he said,

"First is the danger of futility; the belief

that there is nothing one man or one woman can

do against the enormous array of the world's

ills - against misery, ignorance, injustice and

violence.

Yet many of the world's great movements, of thought and action, have flowed from the work of a single man or woman. A young monk began the Protestant reformation, a young general extended an empire from Macedonia to the borders of the earth, and a young woman reclaimed the territory of France.

It was a young Italian explorer who discovered the New World, and 32-year-old Thomas Jefferson who proclaimed that all men are created equal. "Give me a place to stand," said Archimedes, "and I will move the world." These men moved the world, and so can we all.

We have a special opportunity that starts today to chart a new course for the City of Scranton. In my six years on Council I have never been more hopeful that we could overcome our challenges by working together with our new Mayor Paige Cognetti.

In the past, these reorganization meetings have amounted to nothing more than lip service. Everyone pledges to work together and solve issues in January and a few months go by and it seems like we're stuck in neutral. At least that's been my experience in the past.

We stand at a critical moment in the City's history where we can actually make a difference or we can maintain the status quo. We must work closely with Mayor Cognetti and her administration while maintaining Council's role as a check and balance and understanding that dissent, disagreement and debate should not be looked down upon but appreciated and encouraged as long as it's done in a respectful manner with the best interest of the City in mind.

I pledge to all of you today that this Council is willing and ready to get to work, be open and honest with the people of the City and begin to write the City's next chapter. Thank you and God bless the City of Scranton.

Now I ask Father Edwards to come forward once again to offer the benediction.

(Benediction by Father Edwards.) Thank you, Father MR. GAUGHAN: Edwards. The next regularly scheduled meeting of Council will be held on Tuesday, January 14th, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. If there is no further business, I will entertain a motion to adjourn. MR. DONAHUE: Motion to adjourn. MR. GAUGHAN: This meeting is adjourned. Thank you for coming, everyone.
