So I think we have to just continue to practice what we've been practicing. And I urge everyone to observe patience in that. I know it's not easy to do. But I think it needs to be done for the betterment of everybody else. That's all I have.

MR. GAUGHAN: Thank you, Councilman Donahue. I just have a few comments. First, Council received an update from Art Moretti today on the gas card audit report. This is something that really has been evolving over the past few months.

Mr. Moretti reported to Council today that the draft report is complete and has been sent out for final review. Final review is a two-day process which includes review of the schedules, work papers and narratives. Should there be no significant issues, Mr. Moretti expects to release the report on Friday.

Council had previously requested

Mr. Moretti's participation in a future meeting

once the report was received. So if Council

does receive that report Friday, I had asked in

caucus to have Mr. Moretti in for our caucus next Tuesday so that we can have him present that report and ask any questions.

And certainly if we receive it
Friday, that will be placed in Third Order on
our agenda so the public could review that as
well. So that's an update on the gas card
situation. The other thing that I just wanted
to mention, for anyone in the public that has
any questions at this time regarding City
operations or the City's coronavirus response,
anything really related to the coronavirus, you
could send those requests and those questions
to Scranton311@scrantonpa.gov or you can call
570-348-4101.

The Mayor and her administration have set up this system to field any sort of questions on any of the operations of the City at this time and our response to the coronavirus pandemic.

Also on the City's website

Scrantonpa.gov, there are a number of lists of resources for people who are in need of food or shelter, help with their utilities, services for veterans, so on and so forth.

So if you have access to a computer, please utilize the City's website. There is a ton of information on there. And if you don't have access to the computer you could call, again, 570-348-4101.

As Councilman Donahue mentioned, I just want to caution people again in the City to please follow the guidelines set forth by our medical professionals here in the state.

Governor Wolf has extended the shelter-in-place order until May 8th, which we all know.

And we have to follow this for the safety of not only ourselves but of everybody else. The news of the amount of deaths in the nursing homes is just -- I can't even -- there are no words for it and the heartache that goes along with that.

So we need to again, not only worry about ourselves but worry about everybody else. I could not believe my eyes yesterday when I saw the utter selfishness and ignorance of people gathered in large crowds down in Harrisburg to protest Governor Wolf's orders.

Every single one of us wants to get back to normal and eventually we will. But for

now we have to stay home. We have to stay away from large crowds as much as we possibly can.

For the most part from what I've seen, the people of Scranton have done a relatively good job in listening in to the guidelines and the shelter-in-place order. But we can't become complacent. And, you know, my concern is -- and I talked to the Mayor extensively about this that, you know, on May 8th everyone thinks that they can just go out and go back to normal.

It's going to be a gradual process hopefully. But this isn't a one size fits all situation. And we can't treat it like that.

So we need to continue to do our part. We need to continue to have hope as well although that is difficult.

There are a number of agencies.

There are a number of people in our City that are out there willing to help you if you have mental health issues or if you're in need of food or shelter, please call the number that I gave you before or go to scrantonpa.gov or send your questions or concerns to

Scranton311@scrantonpa.gov and someone will put

you in the right place for that because, you know, I just went for a ride with my wife and kids just to get out of the house yesterday.

And you see people walking around and you wonder if they are in the same situation as I am where we can order food and have it delivered to our house. There's many people in our City who can't do that.

There's many people in nursing homes who haven't seen their family. There's many elderly people who live by themselves. So we need to look out for each other during this crisis. And I think that we are. We're doing a good job with that and I hope that we will continue to do that. And I'm confident that we will get through this.
