SCRANTON, PA – During this public health crisis, Mayor Cognetti urges residents to heed the warnings of the medical community and implement best practices for social distancing. The City of Scranton remains in a State of Emergency, with police, fire and public works operating to protect the safety and health of Scranton residents.

Earlier today, Governor Wolf announced measures to help stop the spread of COVID-19, including ceasing non-essential government operations and recommending businesses do the same. A list of the types of businesses the PA Department of Health recommends cease operations can be found here.

Additionally, the Governor ordered all restaurants and bars to close their dine-in facilities effective Tuesday, March 17 for 14 days. Businesses that offer carry-out, delivery, and drive-through food and beverage service may continue to do so, but eating and drinking inside restaurants and bars is temporarily prohibited.

Mayor Cognetti will hold a press conference on the City Hall steps on Tuesday, March 17 at 2 p.m. to provide updates regarding City services and resources available to residents (see below for resources already available).
