One, the grantee, that's Mr. Rinaldi's company, shall develop the premises (The Redevelopment Project) pursuant to the terms of the development agreement between the grantor, the Scranton Redevelopment Authority and the grantee which development agreement was approved by City Council of City of Scranton on March 4, 2004, pursuant to Resolution No. 19 of 2004, and a second condition, the grantee shall commence and complete the redevelopment project within a reasonable time after the date of this deed, which is November 5, If the grantee shall fail to commence 2008. and complete the redevelopment project

9	many of the good steps we believe that the
10	commissioners have taken, along with the
11	revenue and finance staff to put the county
12	in a good fiscal position have paid off
13	especially in this budget.
14	First of all, the question always
15	everybody asks me what will the tax rate be?
16	The tax rate stays the same this year as it
17	has for the last five years at 57.42 mils
18	for your county taxes so there is no tax
19	increased included in this budget. This is
20	the fifth budget now starting with the 2013
21	budget where the tax rate has been set at
22	that level so, again, no tax increase this
23	year as projected in the county budget.
24	If you go down on the first page it
25	talks a little bit about some of the

specific financial steps, the restoration of our bond rating late last year was a great help, particularly in regards to several refinancing initiatives that we conducted that included converting the last few pieces of hanging fruit in terms of variable rate debt into fixed rate loans. That will open several other refinancings that the commissioners have completed over the last several months to put us in a position where we saved approximately \$1 million on our budgeted debt service from the current budget through to the start of this coming one. So, again, many steps we have taken to put the county in a good fiscal position we have seen come to fruition now. I know you guys know this take years sometimes to make those pieces fit together on the jigsaw board and now many of them have lined up for us and we look forward to seeing more in that regard.

And just one other item to note on that, all of the documents that we talked about here as well as the complete budget on PDF format comes to about 130 pages are available on the county's website at www.lackawannacounty.org. All of our budgets are on there going back to I think 2006 or so and all our audits run all the way back to I think 2002 so if anyone wants to compare and contrast and read through the details all information is there.

And just one other item that we have, our Emergency Management Agency along with the National Weather Service has a winter weather Skywarn course coming up. Skywarn is a program that the National

Weather Service run where individuals who volunteer for this service work with the National Weather service during a weather event, a snow storm, thunderstorms, to provide whether reporting to the NWS, in this case their Binghamton operation from a safe location. This isn't a storm chaser training or anything like that, but these people volunteer to provide real time weather information, so the course is at the Lackawanna County 911 center in Jessup, Wednesday, November 9, 6:30 p.m., it is free, refreshments are provided. A really neat program for anyone who is into weather and metrology so that's all we have. Are there any questions on the budget or anything else? MR. WECHSLER: We are all going to jump in. MR. Currently, they have seven day a week roving patrols by their outsource company named Prestige. Roving patrol is the guard goes through the garage and parks their car out front, it's well-marked and he is an armed guard. He will you walk from the ground to the roof and back down. He will get back in his car and he goes to the next garage and he does that his entire shift and they have that on seven days a week.

2	They have a 67 working cameras that
3	cover every entry, elevator, payment machine
4	and stairwell in all garages. Their
5	lighting is at 90 percent operational, which
6	is up from the 75 percent operational from
7	the time they took over. I asked them
8	what's with the 10 percent, how come there
9	is 10 percent that's not working and they
10	are work on upgrading the whole ballast
11	system to be replaced. It's not just as
12	simple as putting in a new bulb in and some
13	of these older ballasts, you know, they are
14	just not it would be just a lot better if
15	you got the new ballasts put in, change the
16	light bulb and then use those lights for
17	years at a time. So that's where they are
18	with the lighting.
19	Future plans, they are going to be
20	reducing the square footage of their garages
21	to eliminate low traffic level. Some
22	garages they are just take the top level
23	right off because no one ever parks on it,
24	they are not just needed and once they get
25	rid of all of the dead space that are going

to condense all the parking which is going to make for a less dead areas of the garages which is going to make that a lot safer. Α lot of the high risk people areas where people would like to hide out. They are going to restructure the contract with their security company Prestige. What they would like to do just for that accountability blanket is to put in a detect system which basically a detect system is when the guard gets to a garage he wands a section of it's almost like a swipe card that he touches with his wand and that knows that that guard was there at that time and they can monitor where they have been at what time of day, what day of the week they work, you know, make sure there is no one sleeping in their car not doing what they should be doing. It's a very good accountability system. Thirdly, they are going to be adding and upgrading 20 to 30 cameras. Right now their camera system that they have all go to

I was glad to see that the demolition of 1021 Richmont Street was put on hold by the city. I had several conversations with License and Inspection director Pat Hinton as well as Community Champions. Community Champions is a company that registered our foreclosed properties so I contacted them as well. They immediately went to work on this and found out that, of course, it's not in foreclosure, there is no pre-foreclosure papers eminent, but they also offered their help they have contacts with banks throughout the country to see if they could get a contact and somebody responsible for the properties so if that happens I think it's somewhat of a breakthrough to get that situation straightened out. But this situation leads to a larger issue, and it was brought up against by one of our speakers is the current condemnation policy. As any realtor will attest, when

that orange placard that reads "Condemned"

is attached to a property that building in

many cases has just received a death sentence that can also lead to demolition, and if that doesn't happen at the very least the value of that property in many cases can be reduced by almost 50 percent. The property values of neighboring homes are reduced and the property values on that block are reduced. So this is the conversation I think we need to have to come up with better solutions than driving down property values and demolishing buildings. In some cases, demolition may be the only answer but in many cases the home may be rehabilitated, put back on the market for sale and that simply is not happening because the policies we have in place does not foster redevelopment or encourage home ownership.

The DPW director said that ideally the leaves should be placed in paper bags and paper can be recycled right in with the leaves and he is planning, our DPW director, on speaking with the mayor regarding the potential notice in the paper prior to the first scheduled pick up so that people know when to put their leaves out so that is also a positive note.

And on the issue of condemnation and Licensing and Inspections Department, I received two e-mails this week, we all did from two developers in the city, and I'm not going to go into them because they are very lengthy, but basically the e-mails had to do with selective enforcement by our Licensing and Inspections Department which I think is a terrible problem that we have up there. You know, I really think, and I have harped

on this a lot over the last few weeks, that our Licensing and Inspections Department needs to get their act together. That is it the department that right now I think is totally out of control. They are getting sued left and right by different people throughout the city because, in my opinion, it depends on who you know and where you live and if you get a ticket or not or if you get your house condemned or, you know, if the laws are actually enforced or not enforced, so I think that Mayor Courtright needs to get this department under control because we are losing many thousands and thousands of dollars from people who want to invest in the community but who are totally turned off by the lack of professionalism in that office, and I have heard this for the three years that I have been on city council so hopefully he can take care of that. And one final note, Mrs. Schumacher

1 inspectors to go look at some of the paving 2 work that was being done over in West Side 3 and he assured me that everything was being done to code up there. 4 5 He also did remind me though that 6 there is a problem after the paving is 7 completed that Pennsylvania American Water 8 remains responsible for any repairs of any 9 paving job that perhaps has a flaw in it or 10 some kind of an issue with the quality of 11 work Pennsylvania American Water is 12 responsible for doing that repair. 13 I did meet with the mayor this week 14 to talk about a couple different items, one of them was the Butcher Avenue on East 15 16 Mountain by the Irish Cultural Center, it's 17 in a very bad state of disrepair. They are 18 going to do some temporary milling and 19 paving to get the road through the winter 20 and then next year we'll take a look at what 21 type of paving is available for that road. 22 I also did speak to the mayor 23 concerning the State of the City address, I 24 believe right now it's tentatively scheduled 25 for November 4, that's a Friday, and it will

be at the Chamber of Commerce building. The Chamber of Commerce requests that it's there to serve the people of the community and it will be taped and televised for future reference. The time will be confirmed I guess within the next couple of days we were told.

Speaking about the Lace Works, I'm not sure if Mr. Bolus was aware that all of those buildings at the Lace Works are not going to be repaired, there are a lot of buildings over there that are going to demolished and there is going to be new construction and they are going to try to save the historical part of these buildings I understand that Mr. Rodham that they can. did work there, but I look at that place more as a tribute to the thousands of people that worked there constantly. It's not a tribute to one man, it's a tribute to the families and the workers of the Lace Works. I worked for 20 years over in that neighborhood and you can just feel a sense of history when you go there. All of the homes are built exactly the same, it was

2	the same experience. It was a tight
3	community over there and I don't think we do
4	anybody a service saying that that project
5	should not move forward.
6	As Mr. Rogan said, there is still
7	people that are committed to that
8	neighborhood and the investment that we
9	don't have any cash. The only investment
10	that we can make is to forego taxes. That's
11	it. And I think it's a wise investment to
12	stabilize that neighborhood. I am concerned
13	though, and I don't want to disagree with my
14	colleagues, but I don't think that that area
15	can ever become not a flood plain. It's 150
16	year level. There is different levels, but
17	that area will always remain in the flood
18	plain. The insurance requirements are
19	dropped because of the levy system that's
20	there, I think that's protected to the 150
21	year level, so you could have a
22	200-year-level and, of course, it could
23	flood or you could have something worse, but
24	I think the flood plain and the flood
25	designations remain forever just because the

river is there, but if you look back when that levy was first completed maybe ten or 15 years ago it really only had been open for maybe two weeks when the fires challenge to it came and if there was a time that we were going to be concerned that that levy wasn't going to hold it was that day and it held, and I think the Corp of Engineers are very confident in that levy, I'm confident in that levy, so we have seen it save that area twice already so I don't think there's a threat to that being in a flood plain.
