17	the ultimate sacrifice for our country.

20	MS. REED: FOURTH ORDER. CITIZENS
21	PARTICIPATION.
22	MR. ROGAN: Our first speaker
23	tonight is Joan Hodowanitz.
24	MS. HODOWANITZ: Joan Hodowanitz,
25	resident and taxpayer. With regard to Item

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3E, correspondence from Beyer Barber Company
dated September 21st on the City of Scranton
Pension Plan's 2016 Minimum Municipal
Obligation's or what we call MMOs. As you
certainly recall for the last two years, the
city has missed its MMO payment on December
31st of each year. And a result of that was
that we paid 8 percent interest. For the
two years together, I think we paid
something like half a million dollars in
interest. We shouldn't have had to pay.
This correspondence is sent to help the city
prepare for its 2016 operating budget as Mr.
Bulzoni explained during your caucus. And I
think the public needs to be made aware of
this correspondence. And since it's not
part of tonight's legislation, let me just
read the pertinent portions. The funding
percentage of the aggregating plans has
declined from 47 percent in 2009 to 24
percent in 2015, one of the lowest in the
state. Let's see. Ifnow, people may not
realize this, but when we pay the MMO, we're
actually getting a 25 percent reduction.
And you're able to take that every year

through the year 2016. After 2016, there will be no reduction. You will pay the bill in full starting January 1st, 2017. So, the letter goes onto say: If the city should chose to use the Act 44 relief for 2016--it says actually 2015, but I'm sure that's a typo--the MMO for 2016 will be \$14,400,052. If it were paid in full, it would be \$18,695,993. But the reduced number, the \$14 million is not, I say again, is not sufficient to pay for the benefits that will be earned in 2016 and interest on the past service liability. As a result, the past service liability will grow and the funding percentage will continue to decline. This relief provision is available to the city for the 2016 MMO, but will not be available for 2017 and later years. Based on this fact, we recommend that the city make contributions to the plan in excess of the full 2016 MMO before consideration of Act 44 relief. Now, Mr. Bulzoni mentioned in caucus that he's looking at a number of remedies including the monetization of the sewer authority so that the pension plans

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can be superfunded. I would not bet my life on all that coming to pass. We're not getting the tax revenue we anticipated through the end of this year because of the LST. God knows what other holes you're going to have to plug in 2016. The public needs to be made aware that this bill come due may force, if nothing else transpires, an increase in real estate taxes again. And I'm not talking a minor increase, I'm talking a lot. We may be looking by 2017 at our--one of our major Bojinka moments. Remember Bojinka? Bend over, here it comes again. So I hope that the Times Tribune will start publicizing this in the paper and explaining this to the readers because they need to be aware. And I would be very, very surprised if we meet the MMO for this December 31st because we missed it for the last two years. And if we don't make it this year, I don't think we have a prayer for making it next year and the years beyond that. So, I look forward to what Mr. Bulzoni and Mayor Courtright are going to put together in the budget and how they

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1	think they're going to be able to fund this.
2	But this needs some publicity, this issue.
3	This should not be dropped like a bombshell
4	on the public in 2016 and 2017. Because
5	this is going hurt. Thank you.
6	MR. ROGAN: Thank you. Les
7	Spindler?
8	MR. SPINDLER: Good evening,
9	Council, Les Spindler, city homeowner. Two
10	weeks ago when I was here, I spoke about
11	Firefighter John Rivers saving four lives in
12	the terrible fire at Sandone Tire. Not one
13	of you spoke a word about that. But I
14	thought it should get the proper news. What
15	did you decide to talk about? That I asked
16	for Mr. McGoff to resign. And you know
17	what? I'm stilling asking him to resign.
18	He's not fulfilling his oath that he took.
19	I don't know when he was here last. He's
20	still hospitalized. Like I said, he's not
21	fulfilling his oath. And this isn't just me
22	saying this. This is many citizens on the
23	street that come up to me asking for his
24	resignation. Because many, hundreds of
25	people over the years, they come up to me

and say, you're doing a great job, thanks for speaking up for us. And these are the people coming up to me and asking me this. It's not just me. And this isn't a political thing. This is the right thing to He's not fulfilling his oath and he do. should resign. Next thing, I've been a supporter of the Mayor every since he sat on City Council. But if I think he's doing something wrong, I'm going to call him out on it. And I consider the Mayor my friend. But I'm here on something I don't like what I'm hearing. Someone in the LIPs Department told me he's trying to put the LIPs Department out to a third party. And I have proof. And you can check on this. And I was told the plumbing inspector left. Because everybody in that department is unhappy with the director. They don't like the way it's being run. They said they hate coming to work. They loved coming to work when Mr. Fiorini was there. Anyway, the plumbing inspector left. His job was put up to bid. Nobody was qualified to bid it. They gave that out to a third party

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non-union job. It's a union job. They gave it to a non-union person. And I hear four or five people are leaving at the end of the year because of this and because of the director. Also, they were told when they go on a call, to charge the people \$50. And they complain and say, we don't want to walk around carrying money with us. The union fought it and did win that decision. Thev don't have to do that. But I don't like the way this is going. And the Mayor was supposed to be a union person. I can't believe he's trying to get rid of the union. And like I said, this is all proof, somebody that I knew a long time in the LIPs Department told me this. And you can check on the plumbing inspector, if he's in the union or not. I'm really disappointed with the Mayor. I do consider him a friend, but I don't agree with what he's doing. And from what I hear, I don't like his decision of who he picked for the director either. Because nobody there likes him. And by the end of the year, we'll hardly have anybody in that department. And I guess that's what

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1	he wanted. That's all I have tonight.

14	work of literature. We participate in book
15	discussions, special events related to the
16	book. And we have two main goals with
17	Scranton Reads. The first goal is to
18	encourage reading of people of all ages.
19	The second goal is to bring the community
20	together through a shared common experience.
21	And we do that by building a community
22	withby bringing them together with
23	differentof different backgrounds through
24	the love of literacy, art and culture. And
25	this year is our 14th year actually. And we

3	participate in different activities. Our
4	kick off event is October 3rd at the Library
5	at 2 p.m. And I have copies for everyone on
6	Council. So I hope you all can join us.

18	at the caucus. I too told you many, many
19	years ago, you're ruining the city. Your
20	government is your enemy. Your weapon was
21	your vote. And the people stuck up their
22	hands and surrendered to the parties. Where
23	we are is notI say about 15 years of
24	mismanagement. And you're not doing a darn
25	thing through it. In fact, I think you're

going to sit back and try to get anything you can out of this before it collapses. You and I know we're not going to make no payments. If I were you, I would ask the county if they want to buy the city. And turn the whole city over to the county. Ιt probably be a better deal for the residents of Scranton, but not maybe for you. You have lacked any foresight sitting up on that Council for a lot of years. Even when you had the majority, of course it was too late then. But Mr. Rogan, you were there to know why, for all the years, the money that was set up for different contracts were changed. The Mayor changed them up. Janet changed And now, you want to change them up them. again. Maybe not as high as the Mayor wants, but just go up. Tell me how much did we have to pay the Scranton Tribune for advertising for all these contracts that you said we're in trouble with on them payments? Does anybody know the dollar amount?

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MR. ROGAN: I had the dollar amount when we first looked at this, I thought I announced it, but I could get that for you

again. But the point--and Councilman Wechsler is going to make an amendment to this legislation. It's something that he's been leading on and I completely agree with That when we have an opportunity to him. save money by putting these items on the city website versus paying Scranton Times, the city website is more accessible than the Scranton Times. It's free. The Scranton Times, you have to purchase. And even if you read online, you have to pay. MR. SBARAGLIA: I don't have a computer online. That means--and there's a lot of people my age that don't. MR. ROGAN: Well--MR. SBARAGLIA: We're going to be asked to pay even though we're not going to know what's happening. And you know and I know, there was so much mismanagement in the Doherty administration that when you, the majority took control, you had millions of dollars in unpaid bills that were done this way. And you're going back to the same way. You're not going to save the city. We're not going back to MR. ROGAN:

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1	the same way. There's going to be a number
2	of amendments that are made that puts
3	Scranton in line with the rest of the state.

14	Rogan. First, I'd like to comment on the
15	past weekend in the City of Scranton, I was
16	fortunate enough to see the spirit of
17	Scranton very active over the weekend. I
18	attended quite a few of the fundraisers that
19	were held. And once again, I'd just like to
20	thank everyone in the city who came out to
21	support all these great local fundraisers.
22	Last week, Councilman Gaughan raised a
23	question about the parking website. I
24	inquired from Council that name. And
25	actually, it was H and J Associates who paid

for the website. As part of the grant that they received from Allied, Geisinger and Lackawanna, it's part of their function to get publicity out for some of these arrangements that we're working. So the answer to that is that H and J Associates paid for that through the grant money. I'd like to thank Director Hinton and Director Gallagher for correcting a problem that was up on East Mountain. They did a fine job of getting that corrected. And also tonight I was pleased to see as I was on my way down here tonight that the utilities have started to repair the sidewalks on Moosic Street, they are laying down new sidewalks. And just as Councilman Rogan mentioned, this evening just for simplicity, Councilman Evans is going to make the whole amendment for the new bidding requirements. But one of the things that we had talked about as a Council that allows us to change these bidding requirements is that the announcements for these bids are now going to be placed on the city websites. In fact, if you visit the city website right now, the

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test procurement is on the website. This won't replace normal bidding, but it will be posted that all of these procurements now will be on the city website. Which I think is a major step forward along with some of the other amendments that we're going to make. That's all I have. MR. ROGAN: Thank you. Councilman Evans, do you have any motions or comments? MR. EVANS: Briefly on one of my all time favorite subjects which is The fact that we haven't had reassessment. one in 45 years has had a severe and crushing affect on real estate values in the citv. In combination with large property taxes based in Scranton, property owners are facing an unfair devaluation of what, in most cases, is their primary asset, their homes and their businesses. And this can't continue. I'll give you my latest example of an impact of an unfair assessment combined with higher millage rates. As a realtor, I recently showed a perspective buyer a small two bedroom cape cod in a very nice neighborhood. The asking price was

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\$89,000. A fair amount for that alone. Μv client was approved for \$120,000, so the industry--in our industry we call that basically a slam dunk as far as financing is concerned. Well, because of a high and unfair tax assessment, the taxes on this small two bedroom home are \$5,100. When the mortgage broker calculated the monthly payment for the taxes into the equation, the individual previously approved to buy a home for \$120,000 was unable to qualify for the purchase of this home for \$89,000. And this story is repeated throughout the city, day in and day out. We have to fix the tax problem and we certainly have to fix the assessment problem. So I am urging the Mayor and his administration following the November election to immediately get on the phone to the newly elected incoming Commissioners and get this conversation started before it's too late. On the Mercantile Business Privilege Tax, it is Council's intent and the intent of the recovery plan to look into the feasibility of replacing the Mercantile Business

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Privilege Tax with a more equitable Payroll Tax. Several weeks ago, I mentioned some numbers that indicated there was a large difference between the identified businesses that will be eligible to pay the Payroll Tax and those that are currently paying the Mercantile Business Privilege Tax. Since then, it was brought to my attention that those numbers may not be completely accurate because the study mentioned had not been fully completed. While I was under the impression that that portion of the study was complete, I do apologize for any confusion on that matter relative to information not being completed. However. that does not change my resolve to eliminate a nuisance tax that has been, quite frankly, a nuisance to small and large businesses in our city. As well as a constant negative to new businesses wishing to open in Scranton. We need to create a new perception in the business community that we are a great place to do business and we are certainly open for business. I'd also like to comment on what Councilman Wechsler said. His suggestion to

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1	put the RFP's and RFQ's on the city website
2	is a sound, smart business practice. And
3	something that should be well received. And
4	I think what you'll see tonight is the
5	amendments that are being offered was a
6	concerted effort by all the councilmen here
7	and with input from Councilman McGoff as
8	well working together and taking an
9	ordinance and making it better and stronger
10	for the citizens throughout the city. So
11	that's all I have for now.
12	MR. ROGAN: Thank you. Councilman

24	in Greenridge from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. I was
25	contacted this week about the condition of

the 500 block of North Hughes Court. And we have contacted DPW to hopefully take care of that situation. For anyone who is interested, the 2015 Fall OECD paving list is located on the city's website on the main page on the right hand side. And Minooka and South Scranton are the areas that are being targeted. So all the streets are listed on the website for anyone who is interested. We did find out this afternoon that our City Engineer, John Pocius and our DPW Director Dennis Gallagher will attend a 6 p.m. caucus next week to update us on the 2015 paving program in the City of Scranton. I'm going to make a request that the paving list be put on the city's website. I am getting a lot of questions about the paving program, so I'm looking forward to hearing more information and getting an update next I did get a question about the paving week. of North Washington Avenue. And we spoke with Mr. Lopatka who is the engineer on the project. And North Washington Avenue is being paved from Morel Street to University Avenue. And I received a complaint from a

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number of different people that we forwarded to the Police Department about school traffic going the wrong way on North Lincoln Avenue towards West Gibson Street. So hopefully that will be looked into and taken care of. And that is all I have this week. Thank you.

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MR. ROGAN: Thank you. And I'll be very brief. I guess one of the disadvantages to speaking last is I'll say everything that's already been said. But I would just like to echo some of the items that my colleagues, as Councilman Wechsler mentioned before, there were a number of fundraisers in the community this past weekend. And I was able to attend a couple. Not as many as I would have liked, but the fundraiser for Officer Wilding was very well attended. And I was--I got there later when things were winding down, but it was great to see the community come together for a fallen officer. The VFP did an excellent job putting that together. So they deserve a job well done for that. Regarding the double pensions, I did have Attorney Minora

contact the State Police to see if Scranton City Council would be in a position currently to conduct, I don't want to say its own investigation, but hearings with some of the key players that were in that scandal. And Attorney Minora, do you want to give a brief update on how that conversation went?

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MR. MINORA: Well, it was actually a very short conversation. I asked the State Trooper if he would be in a position to update us on the progress of his investigation. And he declined to do so because it is still under investigation. He then requested some information from me concerning members of Council and who the solicitor was at that particular time. And I provided all of that information to him. That really was just about the entire gist of the conversation and exchange of information.

22 MR. ROGAN: Thank you. And I know 23 for myself, I will continue to pursue this. 24 I do think we need to have something at some 25 point for the public if charges aren't filed

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down the line. But at this point, I do
agree that we have to respect the State
Police's wishes and hold off on anything
further. Regarding the bidding threshold,
what Councilman Evans and Councilman
Wechsler said is exactly right. We need to
find a middle ground on this. And
especially when we could be transparent and
save money at the same time, that's a
win-win. The idea of putting these bids on
the city's website makes them very
accessible. And it's no secret and I know
it's been mentioned by my colleagues and by
speakers that the city's website is
underutilized. It is a great asset that we
could use to save money and be more
transparent. And that's what my hope is
that this legislation will do after we make
the amendments that Councilman Evans will
read off tonight. And I know it's been
mentioned before by myself and some other
members, if we were doing an up or down vote
in the current form, I wouldn't be
supporting this. The key for me was the
placing of these items on the city's

website. So those out there that want to do business with the city can do it as easily as going to www.ScrantonPA.Gov. They don't have to subscribe to the Scranton Times or purchase the newspaper. We'll have everything right online as many of the municipalities do. And I hope this is something we can do with many other items and utilize our city's website for the things it should be, to get that information out to the public in a quick, easy and free manner. So that is all I have for tonight. Thank you.
